First Light Recycles

Thanks to First Light's new Jesuit Volunteer, Rachel Doud, we recently started a recycling program. Recycling stations are located through the building for staff, volunteers, residents and quests who have all become actively involved in the process. First Light recycles paper, newspaper, and aluminum. Each Friday, the materials are taken to the Alabama Council Recycling Center downtown. We are thrilled about sharing the responsibility of creating a more environmentally friendly Alabama! Dinner volunteers will find recycling stations in the citchen, too!
