your loved ones or business associates while brightening the lives of homeless women and children. Lights will shine on the First Light building in honor of, or in remembrance of, someone special through your donation to First Light.



You can go online to complete the order form telling us if the gift is made in someone's hon-

or, or if it is remembrance of a family member. Then you provide the name of that person and to whom the holiday greeting card should be mailed. (If you are on our mailing list you will be receiving the order form in the mail.)

Our staff will then HAND ADDRESS and STAMP a greeting card that reads:

"In the spirit of the Holiday Season a generous contribution has been made in your honor to First Light, a Center for Homeless Women and Children. The gift comes with warm wishes for a bright and happy holiday!" Then we write your name as the sender.

The second option reads: "In the spirit of the Holiday Season a generous contribution has been made in remembrance of (HONOREE'S Name) to First Light, a Center for Homeless Women and Children. This gift comes with best wishes for a happy and healthy new year." Then we indicate that you are the sender.

The times are draining financial resources for First Light and for you. We need your support more than ever. This is a way to honor people who matter to you, and also help women and children who matter.




The front of the Holiday Lights greeting card to be sent to your honoree.

COLLABORATION WITH DALE'S SOUTHERN GRILL

2010 - 2011 Annual Report

The following is our year-end summary for July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011.

A total of 928 women and children were served with emergency shelter and essential services at First Light, for a total 6,141 bed nights.

A total of 111 group sessions were conducted as part of the Project Healthy Minds program:

161 women attended Art Therapy

106 women attended Movie Therapy

127 women attended Group Therapy

174 women attended Life Skills sessions

Bible study, prayer services or communion services were held 3-5 times per week in the First Light chapel. Attendance is not recorded for these volunteer-led services, but they are important to our guests and important to providing opportunities for nurturing one's spirituality.

Community volunteers and local universities provided education classes, health screenings, holiday parties, haircuts and manicures, fun movie nights and other experiences for our guests throughout the year.

Of the individuals who left First Light during the 2010-2011 period:

- 99 went to permanent housing
- 42 went to transitional housing
- 17 went to treatment program facility
- 8 went to a hospital for psychiatric treatment
- 10 went to a hospital for medical treatment
- 3 went to a domestic violence shelter
- 82 went to another shelter
- 4 went to a boarding home
- 2 went to a jail
- 1 went to foster care (infant)





She is planning for a challenging trek she will be taking in late October and is using this as an unusual opportunity to bring awareness and financial support to First Light.

A message from Denise Killebrew:

"Many of you know of my love for First Light, a shelter for homeless women and children in Birmingham, and my obsession with the Grand Canyon. On October 29, 2011, I will be combining these two passions. In order to raise funds for and awareness of First Light, I will be walking from the South Rim of the Grand Canyon to the Colorado River and back up on that day.

The route that I will be taking is just under 8 miles down and 8 miles back up. I will be sending pictures of the journey back to the ladies at First Light as the journey progresses. You can join them in cheering me on by making a contribution of any amount to First Light. The goal is to raise \$16,000 (\$1,000 per mile) for First Light and to raise awareness of the inspired and inspirational work that it does to bring help and hope to homeless women and children.
