

Counselor's Corner

Amazing Courage: A Pathway to Healing

She walks into the shelter looking ashamed and defeated. Alcoholism brought her to us. Her mouth is as dry as a sun-scorched desert, yet she manages to ask for help. "I need a place to stay. Do you have any room for me?" A bed is available, but she must answer questions and sign her name, confirming that she is truly homeless. This isn't just a bad dream or another night spent in a cheap hotel. There are no more friends or family members willing to help her out. She <u>is</u> alone. She <u>is</u> tired. She <u>is</u> an alcoholic. She starts to cry...

Something miraculous begins to happen as she looks around her. She begins to talk with others who understand her pain. She receives a smile from a staff member and a warm hearty meal from volunteers. As she is preparing for bed she is offered clean towels, linens, dignity and hope from loving hands. As she lays in her bed that night, she looks up and sees a pipe of all things, probably a part of the plumbing. But beyond the pipe, she feels God. He comforts her, assures her of His presence in this place and offers her His healing touch. She reaches out and accepts it...

This is a true story, shared with permission, by one of the guests who came to me for counseling. God did touch her here, through each of us, and she turned away from the path of alcoholism onto the road towards healing.

For many of our women it takes tremendous courage to enter our doors and admit they need help. May each of us who are called to serve these fine women remember their courage, and continue to offer them dignity and hope. Thank you for serving...
