When she came in to tour the shelter, she fell in love with the idea of sprucing up the courtyard.

Kelly began approaching Birmingham businesses to ask for supplies and funding, and they were far more generous than she expected! Thanks to community support, including generous donations from Lowe's, Kelly was able to obtain a brand new picnic table, paint, tons of beautiful flowers, a tomato plant, potting soil and top soil, and more! She and her fellow club members then came to First Light and spent a few days painting, assembling the picnic table, making decorations, planting the new flowers and pruning the existing plants.

The ladies absolutely love to spend time in the beautiful courtyard. Shortly after the renovations, they made use of the new table and updated surroundings during a Fourth of July cookout. New guests coming into the shelter especially appreciate the beauty of the courtyard and the feeling of safety it provides.

# The mattress project



This past Spring Ruth and I were examining the mattresses in the Emergency Shelter. They were the original ones purchased when First Light opened its doors in 2000 and are fairly worn out. We discussed funding options for replacing them.

I asked if I could "try something." I thought it could be a deeply meaningful experience for women in the community to help women in need by having them purchase a mattress, one at a time. Folks are always trying to think of ways to "make a difference" in their community and it seemed to me that this was a really personal connection that would speak to the heart. This felt like the right way to do this. And so it was.

The message went out via email and word of mouth. One by one, calls or responses came in, saying, "count me in," or "I am sending you a check today."

As of mid June, we had the money we needed to replace all 42 mattresses in the Emergency Shelter! I guess we could have asked an organization for one lump sum...but somehow, it seemed so appropriate to let women make connections in this way.

To all of you who participated...each night as you lay your head on your pillow...know that instead of sleeping on the street, a woman or child is sleeping on a mattress YOU provided And here is a prayerful thought for all who participated in our mattress replacement project:

O Lord, support us all the day long, until the shadows lengthen, and the evening comes, and the busy world is hushed, and the fever of life is over, and our work is done. Then in your mercy, grant us a safe lodging, and a holy rest, and peace at the last. Amen.
