Throughout the years, the guests of First Light have benefited from Art Therapy with Mrs. Marilyn Gross. An amazingly simple art form, the decorative crosses handmade by the women of First Light have provided an additional source of revenue



for First Light, which is returned to the guests in the form of shelter and services. Additionally, these crosses have provided inspiration for their wearers as proof positive that "with God, all things are possible", even overcoming the difficulties and roadblocks associated with experiencing homelessness. In an effort to share with our fellow community members the emotions and talents of the guests of First Light as they make their transition from the instability of homelessness to eventual permanent housing, the Board and staff of First Light have opened the doors of the First Light Art Shop.

On November 18, 2007, the Art Shop officially opened. As a tribute to the dedication of Mrs. Marilyn Gross to the guests of First Light, Board Member, Weesa Matthews presented her a beautiful representation of a First Light cross created and donated by artist Wendy LoVoy of Wendy LoVoy Galleries. We are very proud to have Mrs. Marilyn as a part of our team. The attention, inspiration, and encouragement that she provides our guests are integral to the complete package of care that all of our guests need to succeed.

- Funding Project Healthy Minds, which includes Life Skills classes, medication and transportation assistance, art therapy, movie therapy and group therapy
- Providing a place of hope and love and a sense of family to the women and children who call First Light home


